JUST A THOUGHT . . . (a slow meander through Mark)
Read Mark 10:18-19

Jesus gives a startling rebuke before he answers the man's question. "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone." This is not Jesus admitting to some moral failing on his part, but a reminder that God, whose goodness had been long praised by the Jews ("The LORD is good" Ps.100:5) had already given commandments concerning how to live, about "what to do."

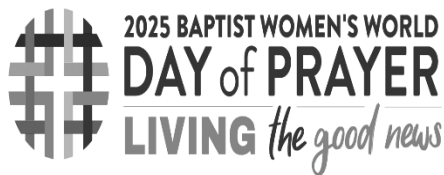
Canadian Baptists of Atlantic Canada (CBAC) Prayer Link:
