JUST A THOUGHT... (a slow meander through Mark)

Read Mark 5:35-36

The woman—and Jesus!—have “wasted” time and now Jairus’ daughter is dead. But Jesus is not ignoring him. He has given him a front row seat to hear this woman’s story. Jesus has not forgotten his daughter either. His words to the fearful woman “*Daughter(!)*, your faith has healed you” become for Jairus “Don’t be afraid; just believe.” In Jesus, the two stories become as one.

How does the grace that Jesus shows to me unite me with other people?
