CRISIS IN UKRAINE

1) Canadian Baptist Ministries (CBM) Ukraine Emergency Relief Fund

CBM is responding to the crisis in Ukraine through our partners at the European Baptist Federation. As refugees flee Ukraine, Baptist churches near the Ukrainian border have transformed into shelters and host hundreds of refugees daily. At present these funds are not able to be matched by the Canadian Government.

2) Pastor Jurek, Regional Minister Katowice, Poland

Many in our church will remember Pastor Jurek who visited our church several times whilst studying at Acadia Divinity College. The churches in his region are packing boxes of medical supplies which are being delivered to the Ukrainian border and are assisting the refugees flooding into Poland.
