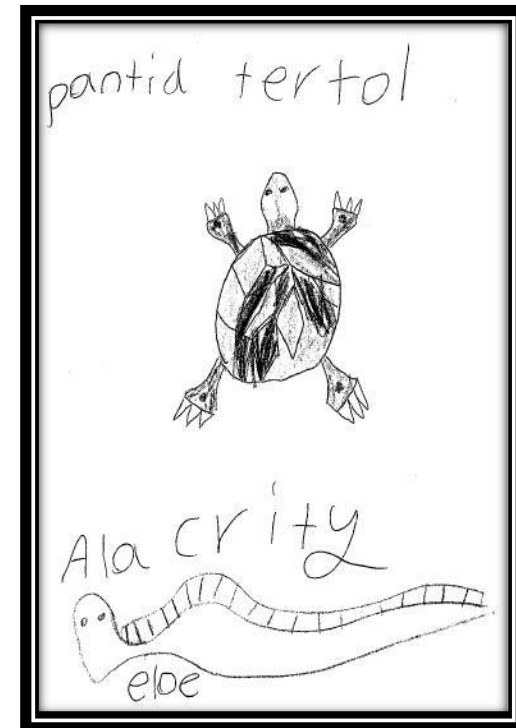

JUST A THOUGHT . . . (a slow journey through John)

Read John 18:18-21

Peter, who had already denied being a disciple of Jesus, is trying to blend in with the bystanders around the fire. Ironically, Jesus stands openly and unafraid under the scrutiny of the high priest Annas who questions what Jesus is teaching his disciples, thinking they may pose a threat! "All I have said to them I have said to the masses. Ask the crowds." Jesus has never held back the truth.

CBM Prayer Points – DRC & South Sudan

- *Following the war in the East of the DRC, there is rising tension between Congo and Rwanda. Both countries are accusing the other of supporting rebel groups. The tensions are so high that some of us are not able to reach our places of work. Please pray for sustainable peace between the two countries.*
- *Pray also for the new projects we have just launched in South Sudan and DRC. Pray that they are not disrupted by conflict and insecurity in the neighbourhood.*
- *Some partners are going through leadership changes. FEBAC has just elected its leaders and CBCA is in the process of electing new leaders at the end of this month. Even ACC&S will be holding elections before the end of this year. Please pray that the Holy Spirit may help to elect leaders according to the will of God.*

CBM – Prayer for International Days: International Day of the World's Indigenous People - August 9

Pray that people all around the world will walk in the way of Jesus, striving for reconciliation and right relationships. We pray for justice, equity, and equality for Indigenous peoples. We pray for protection, safety, and healing for Indigenous peoples. In Canada, we remember and pray for the hundreds of Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women. We ask for God's comfort for family and friends who are mourning. We pray for energy and stamina for the faithful people and organizations that are working with Indigenous women to seek justice and healing.
