Jim Russell, our speaker this Morning

Jim Russell is an ordained Baptist Minister with The Canadian Baptists of Atlantic Canada. He is a Canadian Certified Counsellor and a Registered Counselling Therapist Candidate with the Nova Scotia College of Counselling Therapists. Jim ministered as the pastor of several congregations in Newfoundland and Nova Scotia. In 2000 Jim was commissioned as an officer and a chaplain in the Canadian Armed Forces where he ministered in the Navy and the Army until 2012. While serving in the Canadian Armed Forces, Jim completed the Master of Education in Counselling at Acadia. In 2001 Jim was deployed for seven months as a sea going chaplain onboard HMCS MONTREAL in the Persian Gulf. After retirement from the Canadian Armed Forces, Jim ministered for six years with the Correctional Service of Canada as the chaplain for Warkworth Medium Security prison in Ontario. In 2016 Jim moved to Newfoundland and in 2019 began work as a full time Mental Health Therapist and Addiction Counsellor with Atlantic Counselling Services in Paradise, Newfoundland. In September 2022 Jim began a new ministry in Kentville by opening Russell Counselling Services with a counselling office in Kentville Baptist Church. Jim sees a broad range of adult clients but specializes in issues of grief, alcohol and drug abuse, compulsive gambling, marriage and couple's counselling and counselling those impacted by trauma. Jim is married to Deanna and they have three adult daughters and four grandchildren.
