

From the Board of Stewards

As many of you know, the church approved the roof project for replacing the flat roof over the chapel at our annual meeting in February at a cost of \$59,859 plus HST. This work will hopefully take place in late April or May.

\$15,000 of the funds will come from the memorial fund and up to \$25,000 from the \$77,485 remaining in the unallocated Hiltz funds.

We now need your assistance in raising the remaining \$20,000 plus HST by either direct donations or loaning us funds in interest free loans that we would reimburse annually over 5 years.

The **good news** is that we have already have approx. **\$8,550!** in donations that have come in for this project and at least two individuals who are willing to loan us some funds. Of the donated funds, some has come from individuals, some from the choir and some from the Helping Hands brunch.

We would ask that you prayerfully considering donating to this project and mark on your envelope that it is for the roof fund.
