JUST A THOUGHT . . . (a slow meander through Mark)

Read Mark 5:14-17

The panicked pig herders scurry away. The Gentile people from the area come in droves to see the disaster. All this activity is contrasted with the calmness of the liberated man. He was sitting there with Jesus, fully clothed, totally coherent. Fear of demonic powers among these vulnerable Gentiles was dwarfed by fear of Jesus who was greater than demons. His power was too much.

How do I respond to the power of Jesus when it is shown in my life?
